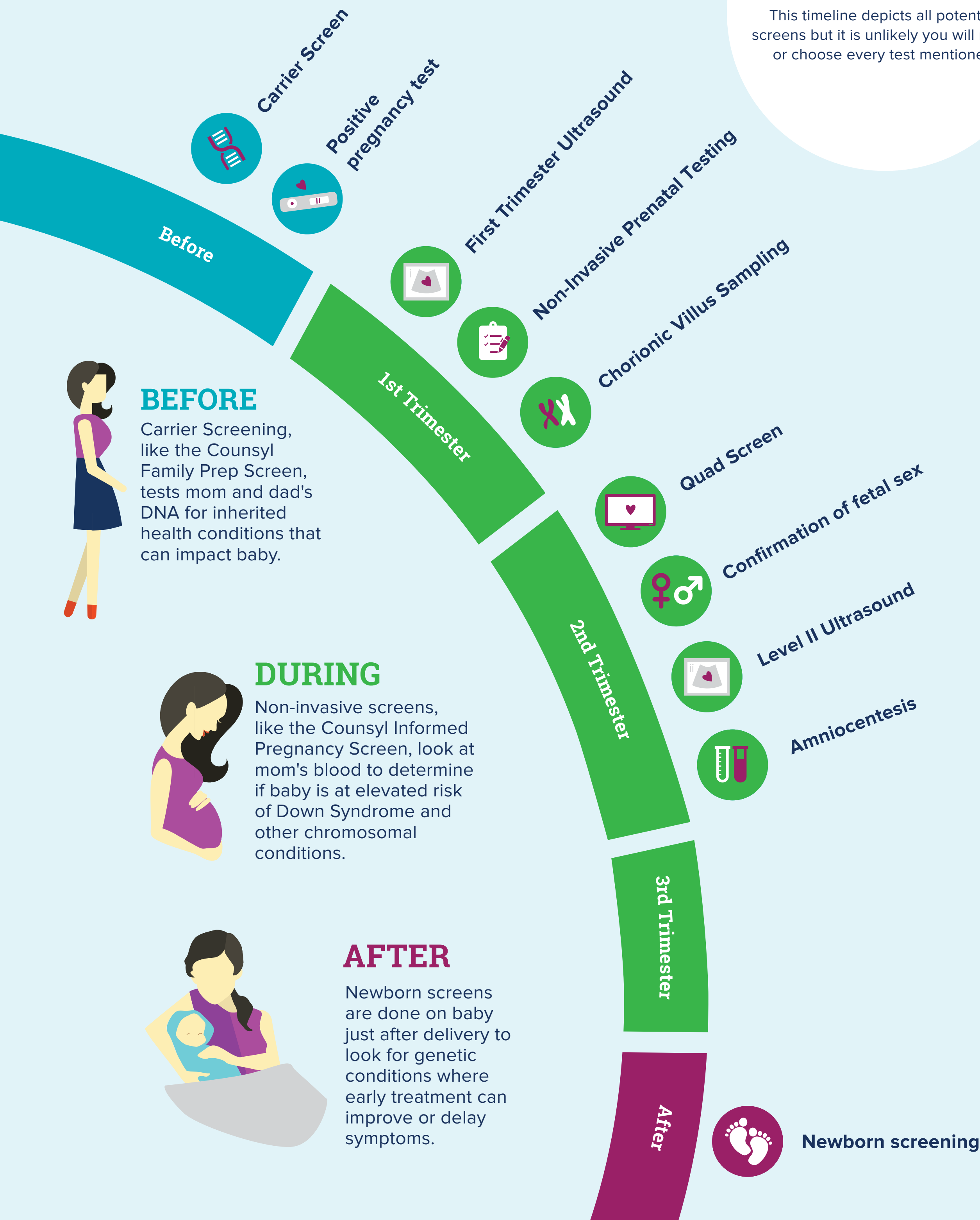


# It's not your mother's pregnancy.

Genetic screening, today a routine part of obstetric care, has made great strides since the mid-1980s. This handy pregnancy screening timeline showcases all of the potential screens you will experience that help ensure you and your baby are on track for a healthy future.

## REMEMBER

This timeline depicts all potential screens but it is unlikely you will need or choose every test mentioned.



### BEFORE

Carrier Screening, like the Counsyl Family Prep Screen, tests mom and dad's DNA for inherited health conditions that can impact baby.

### DURING

Non-invasive screens, like the Counsyl Informed Pregnancy Screen, look at mom's blood to determine if baby is at elevated risk of Down Syndrome and other chromosomal conditions.

### AFTER

Newborn screens are done on baby just after delivery to look for genetic conditions where early treatment can improve or delay symptoms.
